Baroness Janet Whitaker (Chair)

Baroness Whitaker is a Labour life peer. After a career in academia, publishing, and the civil service, she joined the House of Lords in 1999. She has pursued her interests in architecture and design, international development and race relations on a number of Lords committees and is a member of the House of Lords Select Committee on National Built Environment Policy.

Professor Matthew Carmona

Matthew Carmona is Professor of Planning and Urban Design at the Bartlett School of Planning, University College London. His research focuses on policy for delivering better quality built and natural environments. Matthew is on the editorial board a number of learned journals. He is a regular advisor to government and government agencies both in the UK and internationally. He is a Design Council CABE Built Environment Expert. Between 2003 and 2011 he served as Head of the Bartlett School of Planning. He is the expert advisor to the House of Lords Select Committee on National Built Environment Policy. Matthew is convener of the Place Alliance, which is supported on a pro bono basis by the Bartlett.

Baroness Kay Andrews OBE, FSA

Baroness Andrews is a Labour life peer. After a career in research and policy development she was created a peer in May 2000. In the House of Lords she served as a Government Whip from May 2002 and was a Government Spokesperson for Education and Skills; Health; and Work and Pensions until May 2005. She was then appointed Parliamentary Under Secretary of State at the Department for Communities and Local Government. She left Government in July 2009. She was then appointed the first woman to Chair English Heritage. She stood down in July 2013. She is a Vice President of the Campaign for National Parks, President of the Friends of Lewes and a Trustee of the Prince's Regeneration Trust. She is a member of the House of Lords Select Committee on National Built Environment Policy.

Ben Rogers

Ben Rogers is the Director of Centre for London. He is a writer and policy thinker, with a particular focus on cities, citizenship, social capital, public service reform, and the built environment. Prior to founding Centre for London Ben was an Associate Director of IPPR from 2003 – 2007. He subsequently led strategy teams in Haringey Council, DCLG and The Prime Minister's Strategy Unit. There he was responsible for producing, in May 2009, World Class Places, the cross government strategy for improving quality of place. Ben has written several acclaimed books on philosophy and history. He is a visiting fellow of the Royal Society of Arts, and was a member of the Mayor's London Finance Commission. Ben is a member of the King's Commission on the Future of London and on the Advisory Board of the Mile End Institute.
